2016 Open Show & Competition Program

CATEGORIES

1. IN HAND	Any class where the horse is shown in hand (halter, English or western showmanship, in hand trail or longline)
2. ENGLISH	All flat classes where the horse is shown with an English saddle
3. WESTERN	Any western pleasure, western horsemanship, western riding or trail classes where the horse is shown with a western saddle
4. PERFORMANCE	Any reining, cattle, working hunter/jumper, hunter hack, driving, games classes, or other approved events
5. YOUTH	Any of the above classes where the exhibitor is 18 years of age and under
6. AMATEUR	Any of the above classes where the exhibitor is 19 years of age and over who holds an amateur card or is eligible to hold an amateur card per APHA rules
7. AGGREGATE	Accumulated points earned in all eligible classes in all the categories listed above; all shows to count; open to all exhibitors regardless of status (youth, amateur, open)

QUALIFYING RULES

- Exhibitors must be BC Paint Horse Club members and pay an OSCP enrollment fee of \$25 for each horse/exhibitor combination before any points accumulate. Use the 2015 membership application form to remit your OSCP dues.
- Any open horse show in BC attended by a member between December 1 and November 30 is eligible for point tabulation.
- Results will also be accepted from members who participate in APHA classes at non-BCPHC sanctioned shows in northern BC (for example, Terrace, Dawson Creek, etc.).
- Placings earned at schooling shows are eligible for point tabulation.
- Points earned in all breed, open, BC owner handler, futurity and stake classes at breed shows are eligible for point tabulation.
- Eligible shows must be governed by a published set of rules, i.e. Equine Canada, BC Heritage or club rules.
- All shows must keep official records and must be able to verify placings and entries if requested.
- All horses must be registered with the American Paint Horse Association in either the regular or Solid Paint Bred registry.
- Solid Paint Bred horses are eligible for awards in all categories

SHOW RESULTS

- Show result forms are available to download from the BCPHC website [www.bcpHC.com].
- Show results must be submitted to the Open Show & Competition Program points keeper within 60 days of the show date with the exception of October and November shows. All show results must be received by the pointskeeper by December 15. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure the results form is properly completed and

forwarded to the points keeper. Exhibitors are encouraged to submit a show bill to the points keeper for reference.

POINT SYSTEM

- An exhibitor's best five shows *per category* will count towards the Open Show & Competition Program awards.
- Points earned in *all eligible classes per category* at a single show will be tabulated.
- Points are accumulated on a single horse/exhibitor combination.
- Show results filed with the Open Show & Competition Program points keeper are subject to random checks for authenticity.
- The Open Show & Competition Program Committee will decide the final ruling on questionable results.
- A tie breaker shall determine the sole high point and reserve high point in each category. The horse/handler combination receiving the most first placings will be awarded the high point. If this does not break the tie, then the next highest results will be used until the tie is broken. Otherwise, the award will be provided equally to both exhibitors.
- Points will be awarded according to the following chart.
